

Pottstown Community Survey

- ➤ To gather information about the health and well-being of residents underrepresented in earlier needs assessments
- Hear from residents that live in neighborhoods with long term disinvestment
- Direct funding to the programs and projects in our neighborhoods that will have the greatest impact.

Selected Block Groups





- ▶ 23,443 Residents
- ► About 70% White, 23% Black/AA, 7% Latino
- Median household income about \$50K
- ► About 30% of adults live below 150% of the poverty line

- ► About 40% of Pottstown residents
- Nearly two-thirds of Black/AA and Latino residents
- Median household income approximately \$25K
- ► About 50% of adults live below 150% of the poverty line

Methods



- Address-based survey of every household in six Census Block Groups
- ▶ One adult per household: "Next birthday" guidance to account for within-household selection
- Mixed-mode (online, over the phone, on paper at community events, door-to-door)
- Responsive design: Monitored and adjusted processes and materials for clarity and balanced response

Data collection



Initial stage

- Branded invitation letter in envelope with peek-a-boo window
- ▶ \$2.00 bill as pre-incentive
- ► Reverse side in Spanish
- Mailed in staggered batches Spring 2022
- Directed recipient to online survey ("push-to-web" design) or to call to request phone interview
- Reminder postcards

Subsequent stages

- Survey link sent over email (when available)
- ► Community events in Summer Fall 2022
- Survey Ambassadors and Snowball Sampling



\$10 gift card + raffle entry for completion



Responses

- ► 530 participants
- ► 18.3% household response rate¹
- **▶** Modes of completion:
 - ▶ 89% online English
 - ▶ 2% Spanish (all modes)
 - ► 4.3% phone English
 - ▶ 4.3% offline English

Percentages and statistics presented here were calculated with sample weight applied, adjusted for weighting variance

Results reported are representative of the six census block groups that were the geographic focus of this study

Socioeconomic Characteristics of Residents





Housing




- ► 41.4% own their home and 58.6% rent their home
- ▶ 95.1% have internet access at home
- ▶ 19.6% used housing services in the past year
- ► Owner Occupied Benchmarks
 - ▶ **50%** own home in Pottstown
 - ▶ **72%** own home in Montgomery County



Living in Pottstown







- Compared to those who lived in Pottstown for 11 or more years, adult residents who have lived in Pottstown for 10 years or less:
 - ➤ Are more likely to rent (53.9%) than to own (46.1%) their home**
 - Are no different in terms of poverty, race, or education

Education




- ► 54.3% of adult residents have a high school degree or less
- ▶ 27.5% have some college credit or an Associate degree
- ► 17.7% have a Bachelor's degree or higher
- ► Education attainment benchmarks
 - 21% have Bachelor's degree or higher in Pottstown
 - ▶ 50% have Bachelor's degree or higher in Montgomery County



Race/Ethnicity and Income





- Above 200% FPL
- Lower Income (150-200% of FPL)
- Near Poverty (100-150% of FPL)
- In Poverty (50-100% of FPL)
- In Poverty (0-49.9% FPL)

- Among those who are the main household wage earner:
 - ▶ 25.9% are salaried
 - ► 66.9% are paid by the hour
 - ▶ 7.2% are paid some other way
- ➤ 53.5% earn less than \$20.95/hour (or equivalent) among those working full- or part-time
 - ➤ \$20.95 was the 2021 Living Wage for Montgomery County, PA, for a household with 2 working adults and 2 children

Childcare barrier	>>>	5.6

- ► Most said barriers are not applicable because:
 - ► Employed and do not want to change jobs (52.8%)
 - ▶ Do not want to be employed (8.8%)
- ➤ 28.2% report one barrier to employment
 - ► Another 13.6% report two or more barriers
- ▶ 8.0% report using employment services in the past year






Prevalence of Health Conditions





Overall Health (self-assessed)




Overall Health Benchmark: 14% of Montgomery County residents in Poor or Fair Health



Ever Received a Mental Health Diagnosis








Mental Health during Past Month











Percent of adult residents reporting current health conditions

Healthy People 2030 goal adult obesity: 36%





Health Insurance






- ▶ 13% of adults are uninsured
 - ➤ An additional 10.7% were insured <12 months of the past year
- ► 14.2% of adults under the age of 65 are uninsured
- ► Health Insurance Benchmark
 - ► 5% of adults in Montgomery County under age of 65 are uninsured






Location of Usual Place for Health Care

Health Exams and Screeners

All adults

- ▶ **71.6%** had blood pressure checked in past year
- ► **51.2%** had cholesterol measured in past year

50 years old or older

- ▶ **73.8%** had blood glucose screening in past 2 years
- ► 71.4% had colonoscopy/ sigmoid exam in past 10 years



Gender-specific:

- ▶ 71.6% of females 21-65 years old had pap test in past 3 years
- ▶ **59.9%** of females 18+ years old had breast exam in past year
- ➤ **72.6%** of females 50-74 years old had mammogram in past 2 years
- ▶ 42% of males 40+ years old had prostate exam in past 2 years




Daily Fruit and Vegetable Consumption



Servings of fruits and vegetables in a typical day:



Hunger During Past Month









Received Food Donation(s) during Past Month





► For 40% who received food donations, this was more frequently than prior to the COVID-19 pandemic






Physical Activity

Days per week exercised 30 minutes or more in past month:


► Mean = 4.5 days




Number of Situations in which Report Experiencing Discrimination Relative to Other Races








Experiences of Discrimination in Different Situations





Experiences of Discrimination in Multiple Situations by Race/Ethnicity








Community Perceptions

■ Usually or Always Feel Safe




Quality of Life

Satisfaction with Quality of Life in Local Community






Social Capital
