# The Pottstown Area's Community Foundation

ottstown Area Health & Wellness Foundation began transitioning from a private foundation to a community foundation in the summer of 2023. Like many community foundations, PAHWF takes a leadership role in the communities we serve by identifying emerging needs, collaborating with partners across the community, advocating for positive change, and working with donors to match their passions with nonprofit organizations and programs in the Pottstown area.

Community foundations are public charities that rely on public support and focus on improving the quality of life for residents within a specific geographic area. In our case, that means serving residents within a

ten-mile radius of Pottstown, including Birdsboro, Boyertown, Gilbertsville, Limerick, Royersford, and many other vibrant communities located within Pottstown Area Health & Wellness Foundation's service area. Existing Foundation assets will forever support the health and wellness of our community, while new funds from private donors will allow us to expand our grantmaking.

Active living spaces are safe, clean, and accessible to all community members to embrace a healthy lifestyle


#### Health Access & Delivery: 7 Grants, \$160K

#### Health Equity: 17 Grants, \$654K


