## Maternal and Child Health Consortium

Raising a child takes patience, love, and a lot of support. The Maternal and Child Health Consortium of Chester County (MCHC) is helping families in and around Pottstown find that support every step of the way. Since 1991, MCHC has been working alongside



parents from pregnancy through kindergarten, making sure children get a healthy start and families have what they need to thrive.



Through its Family Center Program, trained home visitors meet families where they are, offering practical guidance on prenatal care, parenting, child development, and school readiness. The Benefits Enrollment Program helps families sign up for Medicaid or CHIP, SNAP, and other public supports so children can see a doctor and families can keep healthy food on the table. MCHC also offers Child Advocacy Services to help families involved in the child welfare

system stay connected to care and strengthen family safety and stability.

In the past year, MCHC supported **551 people** in the Pottstown area through a Foundation grant, including 56 expecting mothers who received personalized education, developmental screenings, and referrals for mental health and other community resources. Families reported feeling more confident about early

childhood milestones and prenatal health, and children were better prepared to start school.

MCHC began as a grassroots collaboration among local health and community organizations, and that community spirit still guides its work today. By building trust and removing barriers to care, MCHC helps parents and children grow stronger together.
